Dear Housing for Health Partnership Members and Partner Agencies,

I am pleased to announce that the County of Santa Cruz Human Services Department (HSD) has been allocated, and will be accepting, \$203,725 from the California Department of Social Services (CDSS) fiscal year (FY) 2026-27 Housing and Disability Advocacy Program (HDAP) Funding Planning Allocation. HDAP provides housing supports and disability benefits advocacy for people experiencing homelessness who are likely eligible for disability benefits but are not yet receiving them. HSD has contracted with Housing Matters and Senior Legal Services to provide HDAP services to eligible participants on its behalf; referrals to the program come through the local [Coordinated Entry System \(CES\)](#).

After receiving significantly increased HDAP one-time funding during both FY 2021-22 and FY 2022-23, the County has since received sizably smaller on-going HDAP allocations, as described below. In anticipation of this drop in funding, the County utilized allocations over multiple years to prevent a steep decline in service capacity. The County will utilize the new FY 2026-27 HDAP Funding Planning Allocation combined with the remaining FY 2025-26 One-Time HDAP funding to further delay sharp service capacity decreases. In FY 2026-27, the HDAP program has capacity to serve 18 currently enrolled households. *Additional program openings are unlikely in the current fiscal year.* If future funding remains at FY 2026-27 levels, program capacity will continue to decline in future years.

Per CDSS HDAP funding requirements, this letter summarizes HDAP related benefits, eligibility, and program related requirements with regards to HMIS and the local Coordinated Entry System, as described in the September 13, 2023, Letter to All County Welfare Directors and Federally Recognized Tribal Governments in California regarding Notice of Funding for the Housing and Disability Advocacy Program ([HDAP ACWDL](#)).



Program Eligibility:

Individuals, youth, and families are eligible for HDAP if they are likely eligible for disability benefits and are: A) Chronically homeless; B) Homeless; or C) At risk of homelessness. Consistent with established practice, programs should evaluate funding and program capacity to prioritize serving people with the highest needs and vulnerabilities, which should include individuals experiencing chronic homelessness or severe health conditions.

Program Design and Benefits:

HDAP is intended to support participants in meeting two important program goals: securing disability benefits and stabilizing in permanent housing. Grantees and their contracted service providers must offer all four of HDAP's core components concurrently:

- **Outreach:** Activities geared at identifying need, targeting resources, and/or connecting likely eligible individuals to HDAP services, including screening and assessment activities.
- **Case management:** These activities include the provision of care coordination intended to help clients navigate and address barriers to housing and disability benefits, including connections to Medi-Cal, CalFresh, behavioral health agencies, and legal aid.
- **Disability benefits advocacy:** Activities shall include seeking all disability benefits the client may be eligible to receive as appropriate, including Supplemental Security Income (SSI), Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), Social Security Retirement or Survivors Benefits, Veterans' Disability Compensation benefits, and the Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (CAPI)
- **Housing assistance:** HDAP can assist participants in finding and securing interim and permanent housing, maintaining current housing, and stabilizing in new housing.

Collaboration and Integration Requirements:

CDSS requires HDAP grantees to actively collaborate with local, state, and federal housing and health systems to make the best use of available funding and link clients to needed services. This includes collaborating on the implementation of HDAP with Continuums of Care (CoC) and Coordinated Entry Systems, behavioral health systems, medical institutions and emergency response systems, housing authorities, public benefit agencies, and legal aid and benefit advocacy providers.

HDAP grantees should collaborate with local housing, health, benefits advocacy, and social service networks, public benefit advocacy agencies and their broader housing services systems on the development and implementation of



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HDAP. This includes establishing or continuing to support meaningful partnerships with the local CoC, tribal housing authorities, health and behavioral health systems, and other local housing service providers, as appropriate.

Effective July 1, 2020, all grantees operating an HDAP funded program are required to ensure participants served by HDAP are entered into their local Homeless Management Information System (HMIS). In Santa Cruz County, referrals for available HDAP assistance come through the Housing for Health Partnership Coordinated Entry System. HDAP service providers work closely with the Housing Authority of the County of Santa Cruz and other permanent supportive housing subsidy resources to link HDAP clients with ongoing housing resources when available.

In Santa Cruz County, ***all referrals for HDAP come through the local CES***.
