## FY 2024 California Emergency Solutions (ESG) Funding

Overview of the State of California and Local Santa Cruz County Funding Requirements and Process

### California ESG Program Background

- Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) has released a multi-year ESG Notice of Funding Available (NOFA) for \$39 million over 3 program years: \$15 million in 2024-25 and \$12 million in each of 2025-26 & 2026-27
- Eligible program types:
  - Street Outreach
  - **Emergency Shelter**: No Renovation or Major Rehab, but Essential Services and Operations allowed
  - Rapid Rehousing (RRH): 40% of total awards must be for RRH
  - Homelessness Prevention: No more than 10% of a contract budget and no standalone Prevention projects
  - Homeless Management Information System (HMIS)
- Eligible applicants: nonprofits or units of local government that provide or contract with nonprofits to provide eligible activitie

### Significant Changes This Year

- HCD has adopted new ESG program guidelines
- Moving from annual to three-year NOFA cycle: 2024, 2027, 2030, etc.
- Moving from single year to multi-year standard agreements with three-year not-to-exceed (NTE) estimated amounts.
- In NOFA off years, no application will be needed; HCD will simply add new annual funding through a standard agreement amendment
- The contract period of performance for each annual amount will be typically be 21 months, though year 1 if this NOFA with each 19 months

# Allocations for ESG Projects in Santa Cruz County

- \$299,232 FY2024 allocation
- \$209,478 Estimated FY2025 allocation
- \$209,478 Estimated FY2026 allocation

\$718,188 – Estimated allocations for entire 3 years



### Role of the Housing for Health Partnership (H4HP) in Recommending ESG Projects

- HCD requires H4HP (our local Continuum of Care-CoC) to carry out a local fair and objective process to review and recommend projects for ESG funding to HCD
- ESG applicants in Santa Cruz County **must participate** in the H4HP process
- Under State rules, H4HP may recommend no more than
   2 projects for submission to HCD



### **Two-Step Application Process**

#### Step 1 – Local Application:

- Applicants submit local applications to H4HP
- H4HP carries out process to review local applications and recommend up to 2 projects to apply to HCD for ESG funds
- H4HP Policy Board approves project recommendations

#### Step 2 – HCD Application

- The recommended application(s) complete and submit HCD's ESG application in the eCivis portal
- H4HP submits Recommendations Form to HCD



#### Local and State ESG Timeline

- January 31, 2025 HCD opens eCivis application portal
- February 14, 2025, 5 PM Deadline to submit local applications to H4HP
- February 20, 2025, 3:00-5:00 Review Committee meets to review ESG projects/develop recommendations
- February 26, 2025, 3:00-6:00 H4HP Policy Board meeting includes approval of ESG project recommendations
- March 29, 2025, 5 PM Deadline for recommended applicant(s) to submit final ESG applications to HCD in eCivis portal
- July 2025 ESG awards announced by HCD



## Additional Key Requirements in HCD ESG NOFA

- A minimum of 40% of all contract awards Rapid Rehousing (RRH)
- Homelessness prevention is limited to 10% and not standalone
- Rental assistance can't exceed FMRs (HCD is seeking a waiver)
- Must submit Policies and Procedures (P&Ps) for program type
- 100% match requirement cash and/or in-kind
- **Penalty** for not expending 100% of grant award by the deadline: contractor banned for two annual funding cycles
- Housing First
- Advancing racial equity
- Environmental review
- Board Authorizing Resolution must be on HCD template



## Number of Local Projects and Minimum & Maximum ESG Grant

- Requests

   H4HP will recommend either one project for all the funds or two projects each to receive a portion of the funds
- Each applicant must request three years of funding
- Must adjust budget if H4HP recommends higher or lower

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### Local ESG Funding Priorities

- High priority is on RRH programs that are:
  - High performing
  - Targeted to serving families with children exiting emergency shelters (including youth and DV shelters)
  - Use at least 50% of ESG funds for rental assistance
- **Medium** priority is on other RRH and Emergency Shelter that provides housing assistance and supportive services
- Low priority is on night-by-night Emergency Shelter with limited services, Street Outreach, HMIS, and any other projects

# Local Application Submission Requirements

Submit the application checklist and the following via email by **February 14th, 2025, at 5 PM**:

- 1. Local ESG Project Application
- 2. Local ESG 3-Year Project Budget
- 3. Governing Board Authorizing Resolution
- 4. Need Narratives (one page maximum)
- 5. Supplemental Narrative (only for agencies that received ESG funding in the past 2 years)
- 6. HMIS or Comparable Database Report (for 10/1/23-9/30/24 or most recent 12-month period)
- 7. Program Expenditure Financial Report (for 10/1/23-9/30/24 or most recent 12-month period)
- 8. Evidence of Leverage and Match Commitment for Funding Year 1
- 9. Written Policies and Procedures (for all proposed program activities)
- 10. Evidence of Site Control (only for Emergency Shelter applications)
